## **DUES ARE DUE**

It's that time of the year again. Dues and insurance are due as of January 1. A copy of the payment form was included in the January newsletter if you no longer have the one from the Directors meeting packet which was mailed to you prior to the November meeting. It is also on the CFMS website

As noted last month, the general liability insurance policy premium was discounted a small amount this year. We are pleased to pass this savings along to our societies/clubs so you will notice that the per member cost of the insurance will be \$5 for 2021. Dues remain the same. The total cost per member for 2021 will be \$7-a savings of \$1 per member.



**JUNIORS ACTIVITIES**

Encourage Your Club Kids to Compete for a New CFMS Junior Achievement Award

I am pleased to announce a brand new honor that kids in CFMS-

affiliated clubs may now earn, namely the **CFMS Junior Achievement Award**. This honor goes above-and-beyond the "Rockhound of the Year" award that any and all clubs may bestow with a paragraph highlighting a selected junior, who then receives a certificate. Instead, our new CFMS Junior Achievement Award requires a formal application from the junior member and will be scored against other applicants. At the Awards Banquet of the CFMS Show & Convention, the top winners will be awarded a Certificate-of-Achievement and a \$100 check.

Membership Requirement & Age Groups. Pebble pups and juniors must be formally enrolled in a CFMS-affiliated society to participate and will fall within 2 age groups. Group 1 (Pebble Pups) includes ages 11 and under. Group 2 (Juniors) includes ages 12-18. The child's age as of December 31, 2020, determines the age group.

Application & Deadline. An application form is posted in this issue of the CFMS Newsletter. In addition, it will be posted to the CFMS website. After completing the Application, kids must secure signatures of at least 2 representatives from their society (for instance, President, Federation Director, Membership Chair, and/or Juniors Leader) confirming their membership and acknowledging their achievements. They will then mail or email the Application and their responses to the questions posed therein to the CFMS Junior Activities Chair with a postmark of not later than May 1. Questions about the application process may be directed to Jim Brace-Thompson, (805) 659-3577, jbraceth@roadrunner.com.

**Application Guidelines.** As noted on the Application form, the following areas will be considered: hobby related, educational achievement, community involvement, and work related. For each area, kids should provide as much detail as possible covering the year 2020.

Cover Letter. Applications should be accompanied by

a short cover letter written by the child (or dictated to a parent) highlighting any info to which s/he wishes to draw special attention. Basically, "in your own words, tell us where you really shine."

**Scoring.** Applications will be evaluated by the CFMS Junior Activities Chair along with 2 other CFMS representatives selected by the Chair (all drawn from different societies and so as to eliminate potential bias). Scores will be added together and averaged by the Chair to determine the top winner in each age group. The Chair has discretion to break tied scores. To earn the Award, juniors must achieve a minimum averaged score of 80.

**Notification.** The top winner in each age group will be notified by letter, text, email or other method within 1 to 2 months of the deadline, as will other entrants who may not have won. Notice of the winners, with brief descriptions of accomplishments, will be posted in the CFMS Newsletter, and they will be honored at the Awards Banquet of the CFMS Show & Convention. If winner/s are unable to attend, certificates and checks will be passed along in trust to an affiliated club member in attendance or will be mailed.

Thank you to our Executive Committee and CFMS Directors for having approved this new program. Here's hoping to honor someone special in each of our age groups with this inaugural rollout of the CFMS Junior Achievement Award!

2020 Year enter in 2021 - What you need to know about the All American Club Yearbook

IMPORTANT! – A very early deadline for entry in the CFMS Contest is **February 15, 2021** because the AFMS contest deadline is February 15, 2021. Please send your entry to Diane Cook @ johndianedaisy@yahoo.com by February 15, 2021 and it will be judged at CFMS and then passed on to the AFMS.

The All American Club Award is given to the individual club Yearbook, highlighting a club's activities for the past year, including group activities, individual member participation, workshops and shows. Credit is given for participation at meetings, holding officer positions on various committees, writing to state representatives, and involvement in ALAA - all these activities reflect an active club that makes membership worthwhile for everyone.

The AACA awards are recognition of these activities, with bronze, silver and gold levels and an overall 1st place gold award. Take a look at what your club has accomplished this past year, and give credit where credit is due! The more members contribute to the yearbook, the more completely it can serve as an historical document for the club, as well as an excellent tool to encourage prospective members. Canvassing members for any missing documentation, letters, flyers or other materials to fill in some gaps just might make the difference between a good club and a great Club Yearbook entry.

Take advantage of the guide that is on the AFMS site written by John Washburn. "An All American Club Yearbook: A Guide for Preparation." This gives an explanation of each section, and what judges look for in rating the entries. It also highlights areas that are usually the weakest for many clubs and offers suggestions to improve those areas, as well as hints and tips for organizing the book.

PDF entries are welcome as it saves a lot in postage. Page limit is 150 single pages for the pdf, and 100 double sided pages if printed.

The All American CFMS Deadline has been determined by the AFMS deadlines. The deadline for the All

American 2020 year is FEBRUARY 8, 2021. The information needs to be emailed to: Diane Cook, email: johndianedaisy@yahoo.com; if you have a book you are mailing, please send me your phone number and I will contact you with a mailing address.
