How To Build a Successful Kids Program, Part 1: Have a Champion! And Three Reminders from Last Month!

To Build a Successful Kids Program, Have a Champion!

Last year, I conducted a survey of juniors' programs among CFMS clubs, and I promised I would provide a series of articles enumerating "best practices" from clubs that have proven most successful in starting, growing, and running pebble pup and juniors' programs. Here's my first installment. The NUMBER ONE ingredient for success? *Have a Champion!* In our survey, clubs listed two reasons for not having a Kids Program: 1) no kids within the club, and 2) lack of a volunteer willing to take this on. I'll tackle #1 next month. Meanwhile, let's focus on #2, or the lack of a volunteer willing to step forward.

The few clubs that have proven exceptionally successful in starting and maintaining a kids program have one thing in common: a true-blue and totally committed champion. Among the clubs where this has proven to be the case, that champion was either the parent of kids who were especially into our hobby or a current or retired school teacher. Identify who, within your club, is the most "kid-centric." Then encourage and help them to start a kids' program. Begin by identifying the parent of a child who is truly fascinated by minerals or fossils. Or a parent who is already a leader of a 4-H, Girl Scout, Boy Scout, homeschooling, or similar kids' program. A champion will be someone already invested as a parent, an educator, a community leader, or a volunteer involved in a kidcentric program. If you lead a rock and gem society, meet-and-greet and get to know everyone within your society, and once you spot that one person who might serve as a Pied Piper for kids, latch onto and encourage him/her. My own Ventura club has had ups and downs with our kids program. The times we've been "up" is when we've had one truly invested "champion" to take charge and lead our kids. Without a champion, there is no kids program.

However, don't leave your champion out-to-dry. In other words, don't expect him/her to do it all. Once you have a champion, *support* your champion! Without support, there is no champion. For true success, it takes a village and all-hands-on-deck. I'll say more on this in next month's installment. Stay tuned!

Three reminders from last month...

The application form is posted to the CFMS website (https://cfmsinc.org/juniors-achievement-award/). The deadline is March 1. 3) Show Chair's Award for Outstanding Junior Exhibit. Whether entered as a competitive or noncompetitive exhibit, kids who enter a display in our 2023 CFMS Show are eligible to receive the Show Chair's Award for Outstanding Junior Exhibit. No application form needed. No hoops to jump through. Enter a display, and the Show Chair picks out what he/she prefers best. Get a certificate, a special gem, and a \$100 bill! It is presented to a person or couple who is or was a member of a CFMSaffiliated society and whom the CFMS wishes to honor by conveying public appreciation and recognition. Most past awardees have generously offered years of sustained and committed service.

Nominations for people who have performed outstanding work for CFMS should be submitted to members of the Golden Bear Committee. Any nominee must be a member of a CFMS-affiliated society/club. Please note that nominee/s should not be informed of their nomination. It should come as a surprise honor during the Awards Banquet at our Annual Show & Convention.

More than one person may receive the award in any given year. Nominations may be made by the CFMS Executive Committee, a Federation Director of a member society/club, and/or a CFMS Committee Chair.

ONLY CFMS SERVICE IS CONSIDERED FOR THE GOLDEN BEAR AWARD. In other words, this is not to honor service to an individual member Society. (For that, we have the Rockhound of the Year award program.) Simple documentation must accompany the nomination. Deadline for nominations is April 30.

THE FIRST BLM SPONSORED **ADVENTURE OF 2023** HAUSER GEODE BEDS January 28, 2023 By John Martin **CFMS PLAC**


Susy and I left Quartzsite about 7:15 AM MST so we could reach the meeting point before 9:00 AM PST. We forgot about the time change so we had an extra hour to get there



We made a tour of the Wiley's We11 BLM Campground, an nice campground to stay if visiting the Geode Beds, though it is about an hour drive to get there over minimal maintained OHV Roads crossing multiple

dry stream beds and winding up and down desert canyons.

We arrived at the meeting point around 8:45 PST at the intersection of Wiley's Well Road and Route 518, about 50 feet from the Riverside County Line and the direction sign for the Hauser Geodebeds Area. There was no one else there so we waited for the rest of the adventurers to arrive. They came in one about every 5 minutes and by 09:30 PST there over 15 vehicles and over 40 people from several areas from CFMS and as far away as Washington State and Oregon (NFMS),



Idaho and Arizona (RMFMS) and 2 K9-Rockhounds.

While we waited for the BLM arrival we had a small Tailgate Party which had several geodes from the Hauser Beds and

several from the Potato Patch. In the Wiley's Well District there are five different Geode Beds that are open for collecting and hopefully will remain open through the BLM-CFMS MOU.

The BLM arrived about 09:35 AM PST and gave a brief introduction to what was there and what the route

there was like. We signed in as participants and signed the media release forms and had our group picture



taken, climbed into our cars and away we went, about 15 miles on high clearance vehicle Routes (EC557).

After what seemed like a trip on the Mojave Road in 1910, we arrived at the original Geode Site about 11:00 AM PST.


We got parked and the BLM had Home Depot Buckets, Rockhammers, Shovels and gloves for us to use. We used them!
