#### **BEWARE WHAT YOU CLICK!!**

Please be reminded that those emails you get from time to time that appear to come from your club president or other club official may not be legitimate. They typically begin with phrases like "do you have a moment", a payment of some amount is urgently needed, etc., etc. Unfortunately it is easy to fall into the trap and end up responding to one of these emails or worse yet, actually sending money.

It was brought to my attention that some of these "phishing" emails reference the upcoming Convention and Show. As the AFMS Treasurer as well as the CFMS Executive Treasurer, I generally get anywhere from 2 to 6 of these a week. Usually they appear to come from the organization's president.

If in doubt about who sent the email, send an email to the real person and ask if they sent you a message requesting a particular action. If you click on the name of the sender, the email address of the real sender will be revealed. Most of the ones I've received are gmail addresses; others actually originated in other countries. Never once has the email address actually been one used by the person being impersonated.

If a link or attachment accompanies the email, do NOT click on it. Doing so could introduce a harmful virus to your device that could disable your computer or even worse, steal personal information.

What is the best way to avoid falling victim to these cyber=criminals? Learn what to look for and when a suspicious email comes your way, DELETE, DELETE, DELETE!!

## NEW & IMPROVED! AFMS UNIFORM RULES, 9TH EDITION, FOR 2024

The past year has seen a concerted effort to update and clarify the Uniform Rules. The Uniform Rules are now available on-line on the AFMS Website under the Downloads Tab

(https://www.amfed.org/downloads.htm) as Section I and as individual Division files.

Exhibitors interested in a specific Division, such as Lapidary, can go directly to that Division to find what they need. Exhibitors and Judges should also read Section I, which contains general information that all parties need to know and must comply with.

Supplemental information such as the Mineral Classification List, the Reference List of Lapidary Material Names, and the Reference List of Classifications and Names for Fossils have also been updated. For all judges, the Judging Worksheets and Eligibility Template have been updated and standardized and will be found on the website.

Historically, the Rules grew and grew over more than 40 years, but little was ever revisited. The revisions of 2023 are the result of examining the complete text and editing it to fit the needs of today's exhibitors and judges.

The decision to present information in individual Division form was in response to the cry that the Rules were too big and too intimidating to read. Exhibitors still need to carefully read all sections pertaining to entering their exhibits in shows. Quality exhibits draw the attention of visitors, sparking interest in our hobby. It is hoped the simplification of the Rules will encourage more to try their hand at exhibiting in shows, and perhaps for some, to learn how to judge those exhibits.

Next on the list of items to bring into this century are updates to "Guidelines for Exhibitors" and "Guidelines for Judges." The goal is to post these documents on the AFMS website sometime in 2024. The original works are still excellent guides and should be read by all interested parties.
